## Inserting the SIM Card and the Battery

1. Slide off the battery cover ((1) (2)).

2. Slide the SIM card into the SIM holder.

3. Hold the battery so that the metal contacts of the battery are facing down, slide the guides on the top of the battery into the battery slots (1), and then insert it (2).

4. Replace the battery cover and slide it as shown below.


Note

- Make sure that only 3V SIM cards are used.
- Make sure that the standard accessory battery (XN-1BT30) or the optional accessory, high capacity Li-ion battery (XN-1BT31) is used.


## Removing the SIM Card and the Battery

1. Make sure to turn off your phone and disconnect the charger and other accessories. Slide off the battery cover (1) (2).

2. Pick up the battery using the protruding edge and remove the battery from the phone.

3. Hold down gently (1) whilst sliding the SIM card out of the SIM holder (2).


## Battery Disposal

To Charge Using the Cigarette Lighter Charger The optional cigarette lighter charger supplies power for charging from the cigarette lighter socket of a car.

## Battery Level Indicator

The current battery level is displayed in the upper right hand side of the main display and the external display.

## Low Battery During Use

When the battery is running low, an alarm will sound and the " $\square$ " is displayed on the main display and the external display.
If you are using your phone and you hear the "low battery" alarm, attach your charger as soon as possible. The phone may not be able to continue normal operation if you continue to use it. The battery may only last approximately five minutes before the phone itself powers down during a call.

## Inserting the Memory Card

## Call Functions

## Making a Call

1. Enter the area code and the phone number you wish to dial.
If you enter the wrong number, press $\theta$ [Clear] to delete the number to the left of the cursor.
2. Press $\otimes$ to dial.

## Emergency Calls

1. Enter 112 or 911 (international emergency number) using the keypad.
2. Press $\sigma_{\text {to dial. }}$

## Note

- Emergency calls may not be available on all mobile phone networks when certain network services and/ or phone features are in use. Contact your network operator for more information.
- This Emergency number can normally be used to make an emergency call in any country, with or without a SIM card inserted, if a GSM network is within range.


## International Calls

1. Press and hold *** until a "+" (international dialling prefix) sign is displayed.
2. Enter the country code, followed by the area code and the number.
3. Press $\square$ to dial.

## Note

- Enter the area code omitting the first 0 when making international calls, in most cases. (It differs for some countries.)


## Speed Dialling

Up to 9 phone numbers from the Contacts List memory (Handset and SIM) can be assigned to speed dials. You can call the numbers using the digit keys ( $\sqrt{2 \times \infty}$ to and $\square$ ).
For details on setting the Speed Dial List, see "Speed Dial List" on page 43.

1. To dial a number using the speed dial, press and hold any of the digit keys ( $\sqrt{2 \times 0}$ to and $\square 0$ ).
The phone number stored in the Speed Dial List is dialled.

## Redialling

You can redial numbers in the call log. Select from specific categories or "All Calls". Specific category contains up to 10 numbers and the "All Calls" list contains up to 30 .

1. Press $\Theta$ during standby.
2. Press or to switch logs between "All Calls", "Dialled Numbers", "Missed Calls" and "Received Calls".
3. Press or to highlight the number you wish to call.
4. Press $\nabla$ to redial the call.

## Automatic Redialling

This setting allows you to automatically redial the number if the first attempt was unsuccessful because the called party was busy.
If you wish to stop redialling, press $\sigma^{\circ}$ or $\Theta$ [End].
To Set the Auto Redial Function

## Answering a Call

When an incoming call is detected, the phone rings and the mobile light flashes.

1. Open your phone.
2. Press $Q, \bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Answer] to answer the call. Or press any key except $\because$ and $\theta$ [Busy] when the "Any Key Answer" function is enabled. Set the Any Key Answer function in the profile of each mode. (p. 123)

## Tip

- When the handsfree kit is connected to the phone, you can answer calls by pressing the Answer button.
- When the handsfree kit is connected to the phone and the Any Key Answer function is enabled, you can answer calls by pressing the side-up or side-down key.
- If you have subscribed to the Calling Line Identification (CLI) service and the caller's network sends the number, the caller's number is displayed on the screen. If the caller's name and number are stored in the Contacts List, the caller's name and phone number are displayed on the screen.
- If the number is a restricted number, the display shows "Withheld".
- When receiving a call from the person whose picture is registered in the Contacts List, receiving display and the picture are displayed alternately.


## Rejecting an Incoming Call

You can reject a call you do not wish to answer.

1. Press $)^{-}$or press and hold the side-up or side-down key whilst the phone is ringing.

## Letting the Caller Know You are Unavailable

You can send a busy tone to the caller of an incoming call letting them know that you cannot answer the call.

1. Press $\theta$ [Busy] whilst the phone is ringing.

## Incall Menu

Your phone has additional functions available whilst a call is in progress.

## Adjusting the Earpiece Volume

During a call, you can adjust the earpiece volume (and handsfree volume, if connected).

1. During a call, press the side-up or side-down key to display the Earpiece Volume screen.
2. Press the side-up key or $\boldsymbol{O}$ to increase the volume of the call or press the side-down key or $\boldsymbol{\sigma}$ to decrease the volume.
Five levels (level 1 to 5) are selectable.
3. Press $\bigcirc$ when the volume is set to the desired level.
The phone returns to the in-call screen automatically if left unoperated.

## Putting a Call on Hold

This function allows you to manage two calls at the same time. If you wish to make another call whilst you are talking to someone, you can put the current call on hold to call someone else.
To Make Another Call during a Call

1. During a call, press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
2. Press $\sigma$ or to highlight "Hold", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\theta$ [Select] to select.
The current call is put on hold.

3. Enter the phone number you wish to make another call to, then press $\theta$.

- You can also make another call by entering the phone number during a call instead of steps 1 and 2. The current call is automatically put on hold.


## Call Waiting

This service notifies you of another incoming call whilst you have a call in progress.

1. During a call, press $\theta$ [Options] and press $\boldsymbol{O}$ or to select "Hold \& Answer", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\theta$ [Select] to answer the second call.
The first call is put on hold and you can now talk to the second caller.
2. Press $\theta$ [Options] and press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or to highlight "Swap Calls", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to switch between the two calls.
3. Press $\theta$ [Options] and press or to highlight "Release Call", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\theta$ [Select] to end the current call and return to the held call.

## Note

- You need to set "Call Waiting" to "On" if you use the Call Waiting service (p. 141).
- Call Waiting service may not be available on all networks. Contact your network operator for more information.
- Ifyou do not wish to answer the second call, press $\Theta$ [Busy], or press $\theta$ [Options], then press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or to highlight "Busy" or "Reject", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] in step 1. If "Reject" is selected, the call log of the second call is saved as a missed call.


## Accessing SMS Menu During a Call

1. During a call, press $\theta$ [Options] and press or $\sigma$ to highlight "Text", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
The following options are available: "Create Message" to make an SMS, or "Inbox", "Sent" or "Drafts" to access these folders. For details on SMS, see "Text (SMS)" on page 65.

## Conference Call

Conference call is a call with more than 2 participants. You may include up to 5 participants in a conference call.

## To Make a Conference Call

To make a conference call, you must have one active call and one held call.

1. Press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
2. Press or to highlight "Multiparty", then pressor $\theta$ [Select] to select.
3. Press or to highlight "Conference All", then press $\bigcirc$ to join the conference call.
4. Press ${ }^{0}$ to end the conference call.

## Note

- Conference call service may not be available on all networks. Contact your network operator for more information.
- You have more options for the Conference call in step 3:
- To put all participants on hold, select "Conference Hold All".
- To put all participants except the current call on hold, select "Private".
- To end the call with all participants, select "Release All".
- To disconnect from the conference call but still allow the other participants to continue talking together, select "Transfer".
- To put the current call on hold and continue to have a conference call with the remaining participants, select "Exclude".
- To reject adding more participants to the current party, select "Reject", or you can send the busy tone by selecting "Busy".

To Add New Participants to the Conference Call

1. Press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
2. Press or to highlight "Dial", then pressor $\theta$ [Select] to select.
3. Enter the number you wish to include in the conference call.
4. Press $\sigma_{\text {to dial. }}$
5. Press $\Theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
6. Press or to highlight "Multiparty", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select $]$ to select.
7. Press or to highlight "Conference All", then press $\bigcirc$ to join the conference call.
If you wish to add other participants, repeat steps 1 to 7.
To End the Call with a Conference Call Participant
8. During a conference call, press or to highlight the person that you wish to disconnect from the conference call.
9. Press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
10. Press or to highlight "Release Call", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.

To Have a Private Conversation with One of the Participants
If you wish to have a private conversation with one of the participants, you may select the participant from the conference list and put the other participants on hold.

1. During the conference call, press or to highlight the person that you wish to talk to.
2. Press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
3. Press or to highlight "Multiparty", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
4. Press or to highlight "Private", then press to select.
5. Once you have finished the private conversation, press $\theta$ [Options] and highlight "Multiparty", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
6. Press or to highlight "Conference All", then press $\bigcirc$ to return to the conference call.

## Muting the Dial Tone (DTMF Tone)

1. During a call, press $\theta$ [Options] and press $\Theta$ or to highlight "DTMF Tones Off", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\theta$ [Select].
To unmute the dial tone, highlight "DTMF Tones On" in step 1.
Muting the Microphone
2. During a call, press $\theta$ [Mute] to mute the microphone.
To unmute the microphone, press $\Theta$ [Unmute].

## Entering Characters

When entering characters to create Contacts List entries, text messages or multimedia messages, etc., press the corresponding keys.
In multi-tap input method, press each key until the desired character is displayed. For example, press $2 \times$ once for the letter "A" or twice for the letter "B".

3. Press or to highlight the language you wish to change, then press $\bigcirc$ to select.

## Changing the Input Method

T9 Text Input
T9 text input method is a shortcut to enter text easily and quickly.

1. On the text entry screen, press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
2. Press or to highlight "Input Method", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
3. Press or to highlight the T 9 mode ( T 9 Abc , T9 ABC, T9 abc) you wish to change, then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
" 79 " is displayed on the main display.
4. Press each key once for any letter you require on that key.
To enter the word "How", press 400 5000.
5. If the word shown isn't the one you want, press or until you highlight the correct one.
6. Press $\bigcirc$ to select the word.

## Note

- If the correct word is not shown in step 5, enter the correct word again after switching to the multi-tap input method.


## Tip

- If you press 0 instead of step 6, a space is inserted next to the selected word.


## Symbols and Punctuations

To enter symbols or punctuation, press $\#$.

## Using Text Templates

You can use the sentences registered in Text Templates when entering characters.

3. Press or to highlight "Text Template", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
4. Press or to highlight the text template you wish to use, then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
The selected text template is inserted.

## Copying, Cutting and Pasting Text

Using these options, you can complete editing smoothly.
To Copy and Cut Text

1. On the text entry screen, press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
2. Press or to highlight "Copy" or "Cut", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
3. Press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}, \boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or to move the cursor to the first letter to be copied or to be cut, then press
4. Press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}, \boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or to move the cursor to the last letter to highlight the area, then press $\bigcirc$.

## To Paste Text

1. On the text entry screen, press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}, \boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or $\boldsymbol{Q}$ move the cursor to the point you wish to paste the letters.
2. Press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
3. Press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or to highlight "Paste", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\theta$ [Select] to select.
Saved text is pasted.

You can store the phone numbers and e-mail addresses of your friends, family and colleagues in the Contacts List.
Depending on the size of the entry, your phone can store up to 640 entries. In a Contacts List, you can store the following items.

## Items stored in the SIM memory

Name: The number of characters that can be stored differs depending on the SIM card you use.

## Phone: Up to 40 digits

Using the infrared or Bluetooth wireless function, you can send the Contacts List entry to a PC to share the same entries.

## Displaying the Contacts List

1. Press $\bigcirc$ to display the Main menu.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}, \boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or to highlight "Contacts", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
3. Press or to highlight "Contacts List", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.

## Selecting the Storage Memory

You can store new entries in the Contacts Lists (either in the handset memory or the SIM card memory) or view currently saved entries.

1. Perform steps 1 to 3 in "Displaying the Contacts List" on page 34.
2. Press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
3. Press or to highlight "Advanced", then pressor $\theta$ [Select] to select.
4. Press or to highlight "Save New Contacts", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
5. Press or to highlight "To Handset", "To SIM" or "Choose before Saving", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.

Tip

- "Choose before Saving" prompts you to choose the memory every time you save a new entry.

2. Press or to highlight "Add New Contact", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
If you select the "Choose before Saving" option for the memory to be used, the selection is between "To Handset" and "To SIM".
3. Press or to highlight the field you wish to fill in, then press $\bigcirc$ to select and enter the relevant information.
4. Press $\theta[$ Save $]$ when finished.

Tip

- To create an entry, at least one field must be filled. If you create a new entry on the SIM card, you need to enter a phone number.

- From the Contacts List entry that has a thumbnail added, you can change or delete it by selecting "Change" or "Remove" after step 6.
- If you delete a picture added as a thumbnail in the handset memory, the corresponding thumbnail is also removed.
- If the picture size exceeds 240 dots [W] or 320 dots [H], specify the area you wish to display.


## Copying Contacts List Entries between SIM Card and Handset

You can set a maximum of 9 phone numbers in the Speed Dial List (p. 125).
Setting Contacts List Entries in the Speed Dial List

2. Press or to highlight the desired entry, then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
3. Press or to highlight the desired phone number.
4. Press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.

- MP3 sound files cannot be sent attached to a message.

Press or to display the Contacts List. Then press or to highlight the desired entry, then press $\bigcirc$ to select. For details on searching the Contacts List entries, see "Finding a Name and Number" on page 37.
6. Press $\sigma$ or to highlight "Send", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
The message is put in the Outbox and sent. After the message is sent, the message is moved to the Sent box.

## Note

- The current message size displayed whilst you are creating the message is an approximation.

You can send or receive SMS even if you are talking on the phone.
You can also use Text Templates to help you compose SMS.

- To repeat playback, press $\Theta$ [Options] and press or to highlight "Repeat On", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select. To turn the repeat setting off, select "Repeat Off", then press $\bigcirc$ to select. Pressing *** also allows you to turn on or off this setting.
- To adjust the volume, press or $\boldsymbol{*}$, or the side-up or side-down key.
- To skip to the head of the current file, press $\mathbf{~}$, and to skip to the previous file, press in succession.
- To skip to the next file, press
- To display the detailed information of the MP3 sound file (Title, Artist, Play Time, Bit Rate, Sampling Rate), press $\Theta$ [Options] and press $\triangle$ or to highlight "Music Details", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\theta$ [Select $]$ to select.
- To change the MP3 sound file or change the order in the play list, press $\theta$ [Options] and press or - to highlight "My Sounds", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
Tip
- MP3 sound files can also be played back by selecting "Sounds" from the "My Stuff" menu.
- The starting volume of the MP3 Player is 0 when the "Ringer Volume" (p. 118) is set to "Silent".
To Sort MP3 Sound Files
You can sort MP3 sound files in the memory card by file name, date, or at random.

## Calendar (M3-3)

Calendar allows you to easily schedule appointments, which are associated with the date and time.
These entries can also be sent via infrared or Bluetooth wireless technology to a PC to share the same schedules.

## Creating a New Entry

2. Press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}, \boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or to highlight "Applications", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
3. Press or to highlight "Calendar", then pressto select.
The current month is displayed and the current date is highlighted.
4. Press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}, \boldsymbol{0}$ or highlight the day for the schedule, then press $\theta$ [Options]. The Options menu is displayed.
5. Press or to highlight "Add New Entry", then press $\qquad$ or $\theta$ [Select $]$ to select.
6. Enter the subject, then press $\bigcirc$.
7. Enter the location, then press $\square$
8. Press or to highlight the desired category, then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
9. Enter the start date, then press O.
10. Enter the start time, then press $\bigcirc$.
11. Press or to highlight the desired duration, then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
12. Press or to highlight the desired reminder option, then press $\bigcirc$ to select.

## Note

- The reminder functions only if the phone is switched on.
- The reminder will not sound when "Ringer Volume" (p. 118) is set to "Silent".
- When selecting "Other" in step 11, you can enter the desired end date and time.
- When selecting "Other" in step 12, you can enter the desired reminder date and time.
- When entering the desired date in step 9 or selecting "Other" in step 11 or 12, you can select a date from the calendar by pressing $\Theta$ [Options] and selecting "Refer to Calendar".

## Sending a Schedule Entry

The Options menu is displayed.
4. Press or to highlight "Send" from the options menu, then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
5. Press or to highlight "Via Bluetooth" or "Via Infrared", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.

## For "Via Bluetooth"

The phone starts searching for Bluetooth wireless technology enabled devices within 10 metres. When detected, a list of enabled devices is displayed allowing you to select the desired device. The connection can be established and the file sent.

## For "Via Infrared"

The phone starts searching for an infrared-enabled device within 20 centimetres.
When detected, the infrared connection is established and the file is sent.

## Note

- When pairing, you need to enter your passcode when establishing contact with a Bluetooth wireless technology enabled device for the first time except when "Authentication" (p.150) is set to "Off".


## Receiving a Schedule Entry

When the phone receives a schedule entry, a confirmation message appears in the standby mode screen.

1. Press $\theta[\mathrm{Yes}]$. The received entry is registered in the Calendar.
Press $\Theta[\mathrm{No}]$ to reject.

The calculator function performs the 4 arithmetic calculations using up to 12 digits.

3. Press or to highlight "Calculator", then pressto select.
4. Press or to highlight "Calculator", then pressto select.
The calculator is displayed on the display.
5. Key operations for calculation are as follows.


To enter a decimal point, press $\square$.
To clear the entered number or operand, press $\theta$ [Clear].
To do the calculations, press
6. If you wish to start a new calculation, press $\theta$ [Clear].

## Rate Conversion (M 3-5-2)

You can also use the calculator as a currency calculator to convert from/to a home currency using a conversion rate that you enter.

If you select "Exchange Rate" in step 3, you can set a currency conversion rate.

## Note

- You cannot perform step 2 when an arithmetic symbol (,,$+- \times$ or $\div$ ) is displayed.


## Voice Recorder (M3-6)

This allows you to record a voice clip of up to 60 seconds, which can be used to remind you of schedule entries or be sent within a multimedia message. The recorded voice clip is registered in the handset memory or in the memory card. Voice clips are saved in ".amr" format.

## Selecting the Memory

When using the memory card, you can choose the memory before recording voice clips.

1. In Voice Recorder mode, press $\theta$ [Options]. The Options menu is displayed.
2. Press or to highlight "Save New Sounds", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
3. Press $\Psi$ or to highlight "To Handset", "To Memory Card" or "Choose before Saving", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.

## Recording a Voice Clip

## Melody Editor (M 3-7)

You can create an original ringtone, or you can send a melody attached to a multimedia message.
You can input up to 95 tones $\times 32$ voices, 190 tones $\times$ 16 voices, or 380 tones $\times 8$ voices per melody.
The original ringtone is registered in the handset memory.

## Creating Your Original Ringtone (M 3-7-1)

1. Press $\bigcirc$ to display the Main menu.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}, \boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or to highlight "Applications", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
3. Press or to highlight "Melody Editor", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
4. Press or to highlight "Create New", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
5. Enter the title.

Up to 24 characters can be entered.
For details on entering characters, see "Entering Characters" on page 29.
6. Press
7. Press or to highlight a tempo, then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
The music tempo is described below.

- "Allegro (Fast)":

150

- "Moderato (Normal)": 」 125
- "Andante (Slow)": d 107
-"Adagio (Very Slow)": d 94
Tempo is defined by the number of crotchets ( d) played per minute.

8. Press or to highlight " 8 Chords"," 16 Chords" or "32 Chords", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
9. Press the digit keys to specify the musical scale and rest.
For details on specifying the sound level and rest, see "To Specify the Musical Scale and Rest" on page 112.
10. Press ${ }^{*+0}$ or to specify the types of musical notes or rest.
For details on specifying the musical notes and rest, "To Specify the Types of Notes and Rests" on page 113.
11. Press $\boldsymbol{O}$ after inputting one note.

Input the next note after the cursor moves to the right.
12. Repeat steps 9 to 11 to input notes.

When you press $\bigcirc$ during input, the melody that you have entered is played back.
When you press $\theta$ [Options] and select "Play before Cursor" whilst entering notes, the melody, that is displayed on the screen, is played back up to the cursor position.
When you press $\theta$ [Options] and select "Select Part", you can select another chord. Repeat steps 9 to 11 to input notes for the new chord.
13. When you finish inputting, press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
14. Press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or to highlight "Save", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\theta[$ Select $]$ to select.

Your original ringtone is registered in the handset memory.

## Note

- If the capacity or memory in the handset memory becomes insufficient, the message, "Maximum capacity: 1000 Not registered." or "Not registered. Memory full." is displayed. The display returns to the screen of step 15. Try again after deleting unnecessary data.
- Melodies consisting of too many short notes (semiquavers and triplets) cannot be played back in step 12 and the following message is displayed: "Can not play due to too many notes per sec." The screen returns to step 9.
The message "Can not save due to too many notes per sec." may also be displayed, and the screen returns to step 9.
Reduce the number of melodies, replace short notes, cancel triplets, etc. to remedy.


## To Specify the Musical Scale and Rest

Using the keys shown below, specify the musical scale and rest.

When you press the key shown above once, a crotchet is specified in the middle scale (no mark).
When you press the same key repeatedly, the note will shift cycle through the available octave ranges.

When you press or whilst a note is selected, the note will move one semitone higher or lower.
When entering rest: Crotchet rest is entered.


To Specify the Types of Notes and Rests Specify notes and rests by pressing *** or $\#$ repeatedly.


When you make a dotted note or a triplet, press after selecting the target note.


## Note

- You cannot make a dotted semiquaver (semiquaver rest) or a dotted semibreve (semibreve rest).
- Three continuous notes are required for a triplet.

To specify a tie, press $8 \mathbf{m w}$ after selecting the target notes. An underscore ( $)$ is displayed next to the note, and the note is tied with the next one.
To enter the next note, press and move the cursor to the right. Then, repeat the operation on the previous page. If the cursor is positioned next to a note, you can repeat the note immediately left of the cursor when or is pressed.

## To Set the Tone

The phone can play notes using different instruments. You can select from 128 basic tones ( 8 types of: Pianos, Chimes, Organs, Guitars, Basses, Strings 1, Strings 2, Brasses, Reeds, Flutes/Pipes, Synth Leads, Synth Pads, Synth Effects, Ethnics, Percussions, and Effects) and 61 extended tones ( 40 types of Drums (FM) and 21 types of Drums (WT)).

1. Perform steps 1 to 13 in "Creating Your Original Ringtone" on page 110.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\otimes}$ or to highlight "Set Tone", then pressor $\theta$ [Select $]$ to select.
3. Press or to highlight a category of the tone.
4. Press or to highlight a tone.

When you press $\theta$ [Options] and select "Play Current Part", the melody entered is played back in the selected tone.
When you press $\theta$ [Options] and select "Confirm Tones", the syllable names are played back in the selected tone.
5. Press $\bigcirc$ to select.

Now you can create an original ringtone.

To Set the Strength of the Original Ringtone The strength of the original ringtone can be set in 3 levels for each melody.
When you purchase this phone, the strength of the original ringtone is set to "Loud".

1. Perform steps 1 to 13 in "Creating Your Original Ringtone" on page 110.
2. Press or to highlight "Set Strength", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
3. Press or to highlight a strength of the tone. When $\theta$ [Play] is pressed, the original ringtone entered is played back in the selected strength of the tone.
4. Press $\bigcirc$ to select.

Now you can create an original ringtone.

## Editing Original Ringtones (M 3-7-2)

1. Press $\bigcirc$ to display the Main menu.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}, \boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or $\boldsymbol{\square}$ to highlight "Applications", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
3. Press or to highlight "Melody Editor", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
4. Press or to highlight "My Sounds", then press
$\square$ to select.
5. Press or to highlight an original ringtone you wish to edit, then press $\theta$ [Options].
The Options menu is displayed.
6. Press or to highlight "Edit Data", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta[$ Select $]$ to select.
7. Edit the title, then press $\bigcirc$.
8. Press or to highlight a tempo, then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
9. Press or to highlight the number of voices, then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
10. Press or to highlight a note you wish to change, then edit notes.
When you add notes, enter the note correctly on the cursor.

To delete a note, press $\Theta$ [Clear] briefly.
Press and hold $\Theta$ [Clear] to clear all tones.
11. When you finish editing, press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
12. Press or to highlight "Save", then press $\square$ or $\theta$ [Select] to select.
13. Press or to highlight "Save to My Stuff", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
14. Press or to highlight "Overwrite", then pressto select.
The original ringtone is changed. If you select "New", the melody before the correction is not modified. The original ringtone is registered as a new original ringtone.

## Note

- When the number of voices is modified in step 9, the confirmation screen may be displayed. When you press $\Theta$ [Yes], a section of the melody may be deleted.
- When you are going to add notes in step 10, you cannot add any notes if you have already entered 380 notes (for 8 voices melodies), 190 notes (for 16 voices melodies) or 95 notes (for 32 voices melodies).


## Tip

- To delete the continuous melody, press $\Theta$ [Options] and then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] after selecting "Delete after Cursor" or "Delete before Cursor". You can delete the melody after the cursor or before the cursor.


## Copying and Pasting Notes

You can copy and move a part of the melody to another position.
Only original ringtones or editable melodies can be copied or moved.

1. Perform steps 1 to 12 in "Editing Original Ringtones" on page 114.
2. Press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
3. Press or to highlight "Copy" or "Cut", then press $\bigcirc$ or $\Theta$ [Select] to select.
4. Press or to move the cursor to the first note to be copied or to be cut, then press $\square$
5. Press or to move the cursor to the last note to highlight the area, then press


The highlighted area is saved temporarily in the memory. If you select "Cut" in step 3, the highlighted area is cut.
6. Press $\theta$ [Options] to display the Options menu.
7. Press or to highlight "Paste", then press or $\theta$ [Select] to select.
8. Press or to move the cursor to the point you wish to paste the notes, then press $\bigcirc$. Saved notes are pasted.

## Phone Help (M 3-8)

You can view the help list and use it to guide you in the phone's functions.

1. Press $\bigcirc$ to display the Main menu.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\Psi}, \boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or $\boldsymbol{\otimes}$ to highlight "Applications", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.
3. Press or to highlight "Phone Help", then pressto select. The help list is displayed.
4. Press or to highlight the desired function.
5. When you have finished, press $\Theta$ [Back].

## Profiles (M 7)

You can easily alter the phone tone (e.g. the ringer volume, keypad tones, etc.) according to your environment.
Tone sound and vibration set can be customised for each profile.
There are 5 profiles including one user definable profile:

- Normal
- Activity
- Car
- Headset
- Silent


## Activating a Profile

1. Press $\bigcirc$ to display the Main menu.
2. Press $\boldsymbol{\sigma}, \boldsymbol{\sigma}$ or to highlight "Profiles", then press $\bigcirc$ to select.

## CONDITIONS OF USE

## Electromagnetic waves

- Do not switch on your phone aboard an aircraft (as your phone may interfere with the aircraft's electronic systems). Current legislation forbids this use and legal action can be taken against the user.
- Do not switch on your phone in a hospital, except in designated areas.
- Use of your phone's function may affect the performance of medical electronic units (pacemakers, hearing aids, insulin pumps, etc.). When the phone function is on, do not bring it near medical equipment or into areas in which medical equipment is being used. If you have a hearing aid or a pacemaker, only use the phone on the opposite side of your body from where it is located. The phone should be kept at least 6 inches ( 15.24 cm ) from a pacemaker ANYTIME the phone is switched on.
- Do not switch on your phone near gas or flammable substances.
- Observe the rules concerning the use of mobile phones at gasoline stations, chemical plants and at all sites where a risk of explosion exists.


## Caring for your phone

- Do not allow children to use your phone without supervision.
- Do not open or attempt to repair your phone yourself. The product can only be repaired by authorised service personnel.
- Do not drop your phone or subject it to severe impacts. Bending the body and pushing the display or keys with extreme force could damage the phone.
- Do not use solvents to clean your phone. Use only a soft, dry cloth.
- Do not carry your phone in your back pocket as it could break when you sit down. The display is made of glass and is particularly fragile.
- Avoid touching the external connector on the underside of the phone, since the delicate components within can be damaged by static electricity.


## Battery

- Network configuration and phone usage will affect talk-time and standby time.
Using the games or camera will hasten battery consumption.
- When the battery charging alert is displayed on the screen, charge the battery as soon as possible. If you continue using your phone ignoring the alert, the phone may cease to function, and all data and settings you have stored may be lost at any moment.
- Before removing the battery from the phone, make sure the phone is switched off.
- Replace and charge the new battery as soon as possible after removing the old one.
- Do not touch the battery terminals. Batteries can cause damage, injury or burns if a conductive material touches exposed terminals. When the battery is detached from the phone, use a cover made of nonconductive material for keeping and carrying the battery safely.

## Memory Card

- Data may be lost under the following circumstances. - If the handset is dropped, or shook, or force is applied whilst the memory card is inserted.
- When the handset is used in areas that are exposed to static electricity or electric noise.
- Backup your important data in case data on the memory cards are lost due to malfunctions.
- Do not touch the metal terminals with your hands or metal objects.
- Do not bend the memory card or subject it to violent impact. Keep it away from water and high temperatures.

## Aerial Care
